The Whychus Canyon Steelhead Fly Series has been created for The Deschutes Land Trust in celebration of the purchase of The Wychus Canyon Preserve and the future return of Steelhead & Salmon to Whychus Creek in Central Oregon.

The fly designs are based on classic salmon flies dating as far back as 1850, tied by George M. Kelson, Francis Francis and Thomas Pryce-Tannatt. Many of our current steelhead and salmon flies have been modeled after, or evolved from these wonderful classics. The materials to tie these flies are available in fly shops around the world. None of the feathers are from endangered species birds.
